 - a. During my career and as part of my routine work as a forensic pathologist I have performed many examinations on prisoners of all ages who have died in custody including some who have died from self-inflicted injuries. *(NB : it would not be possible to extract and list all of those cases)*
 - b. I have had personal involvement as the examining forensic pathologist with one of the index cases considered by this Review. Michael FLAHERTY who died at HMP Risley on 24th May 2007.
2. I hold a Visiting Chair at Chester University and teach undergraduate students.
3. I am an Honorary Consultant Forensic Pathologist in the Royal Liverpool and Broadgreen University Hospitals NHS Trust and assist in the training of postgraduate forensic pathology students.
4. I am the ACPO Forensic Pathology representative on the interdisciplinary Forensic Experts committee of the Home Office.
5. I am a member of the IPCC reference group for their study “Police Use of Force”.
6. I am the Civilian medical advisor in Forensic Pathology to the Royal Air Force.
7. I am a Member of the Independent Advisory Panel for the Ministerial Board on Deaths in Custody

8. I acted as the expert forensic pathology advisor to the Treasury Solicitors for The Bloody Sunday Inquiry and the review of the death of Dr David Kelly.
9. I acted as the expert forensic pathology advisor to the Metropolitan Police, Stevens Review, and H M Coroner for the Inquest following the deaths of Diana, Princess of Wales and Mr Dodi Al Fayed.
10. I acted as the expert advisor to the FCO, Police and H M Coroner following the terrorist bombings in New York (9/11) and Bali.
11. I was a member of the Ministry of Justice Restraint Advisory Board review of restraint of children and young people in custody (Minimising and Managing Physical Restraint MMPR) (2012)
