Prior to joining team B6 at the Treasury Solicitor, I worked for team A2 from November 2012-October 2013. Team A2 is one of two teams in the Treasury Solicitor which conducts defence private law litigation on behalf of the Ministry of Justice, which includes HM Prison Service. The work carried out in that team, includes personal injury litigation which I mainly carried out and inquest casework. I therefore had conduct of some inquests. The inquests I had conduct of were:-

I had conduct in full (up to and including the inquests) of Daniel Baillie, Richard Guest and George Ireland. I left the team on 4 October 2013 and therefore the cases of Jean Phillippe Duda, Graham Foster-Middleton and Murad Hussein were taken over by colleagues who then attended the inquests in those matters.

The only individual from the above list who was between the ages the review is concerned with ie (18-24) was Daniel Baillie. Daniel Baillie was 21 at the time of his death in HMP Lincoln and his death was self inflicted. The unanimous verdict was he killed himself.
