I wish to declare the following interests (a separate sheet may be used).

- I have had no contact or clinical involvement with any of the cases prior to the self-inflicted death but post the self-inflicted death in one case I have been instructed by the coroner to prepare an independent Expert report for the inquest.
- I work as the lead Consultant Forensic Psychiatrist within the West Midlands/Worcestershire cluster of prisons (HMP Hewell), even though I have had no direct clinical involvement in any of those who have suffered Self-inflicted deaths. I would have professional contact with those who would have provided clinical input to these patients either as a professional colleague or in a supervisory capacity. I believe there are two such cases.
- I currently have been appointed to chair the expert group on liaison and diversion to advise the programme board by NHS England in the National roll out of liaison and diversion. I am lead for Liaison and diversion for NHS England clinical reference group and member of the Clinical reference group.
- I am an NHS Consultant Forensic Psychiatrist remunerated by the NHS
- I have prepared expert Psychiatric reports for crown courts, coroners, civil courts, court of Appeal and other tribunals instructed by claimants and defendants, CPS and the defence in about 800 cases over the last 15yrs. I have been remunerated by those who instruct me or via Public funds.
- I am a Fellow of the Royal college of Psychiatrists
- I am a Consultant Forensic Psychiatrist working for the Birmingham and Solihull Mental health NHS foundation trust.


